(Please note: if the student chooses to take BIO 211, they must also successfully complete BIO 212.) Top scorers receive conditional admission in ranking order based on seats available. We place all other eligible applicants on an alternate list in ranking order. If students have the exact total point count, we will rank them according to the date/time the Nursing application was submitted.
